The Small Charity Week Match Fund is an exciting campaign and a fantastic opportunity for us to carry out additional fundraising. All donations will make a huge difference to us and with the added bonus of doubled donations we hope local people will join in. Just to give you some idea of what your donations can help us with, £10 would enable us to send 15x urgent (1st Class) correspondences on behalf of our clients, whilst £40 will pay for 100 miles of travel expenses for our unpaid volunteers, and £100 will pay for 3 months electricity for the Centre. **Please do help us to help you**"
